Dear Reverend Peter and friends at St Aubin's Methodist Church, Happy New Year!



#### A message from Rev Peter

#### On 14<sup>th</sup> February we celebrate Valentine's Day, but who was Valentine?

Valentine was a Christian priest who lived in Roman times.

Legend has it that Valentine used to go secretly to the homes of the poor, leaving baskets of food and other gifts at their doors. No one knew it was Valentine.

That is why, today, people give secret cards and gifts to those they love.



Valentine also helped persecuted Christians and was himself imprisoned. While in prison, he miraculously gave sight to the prison officer's daughter who was blind. The prison officer and his family became Christians and were baptised.

This enraged the Roman Emperor who ordered that Valentine be killed. Valentine died on February  $14^{\rm th}$  in the year AD 269.

He was made a saint, becoming Saint Valentine. Valentine's Day is more than a lovers' day, it is love's day.

We remember the love of God today, revealed to us in Jesus Christ.

This year marks the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Liberation. The Parish has asked that we host a Liberation Exhibition in our church in May, so it seems appropriate that we continue to support the Red Cross in remembrance of the food relief the organisation provided to the residents of Jersey when food was so scarce towards the end of World War II. Sadly, wars and natural disasters continue to affect many areas of our world and the work of the Red Cross and other relief agencies is as vital as ever.
