The Channel Islands Air Search - the lifeboats' eyes in the sky!

CIAS is a voluntary service providing a rapid response airborne search and rescue service in Channel Island waters.

It operates on a 24-hour, 365 days a year basis in all weathers and provides services to the rescue centres of the Channel Islands, the French CROSSMA and CROSSCO centres on the adjoining French coast and, on occasions, the English Coastguards.

CIAS provides a rapid response search capability in the 4,000 square miles of water surrounding the Channel Islands and the adjacent French coast, an area notorious for strong tides, changeable weather, large seas and submerged reefs. It is also one of Europe's highest density areas for leisure boaters.

A message from Reverend Peter

It feels like we have been blown by the wind out of the other side of January. A poem written in 1947 expresses our perpetual discontentment with the weather in these lines:

*We do not like the gales and wish they were more rare,
Then when they come no more we long for a "breath of air".
We do not like the cold, and wish we were in Spain,
Then we should feel too hot and long for English rain.*

The hymn writer prayed to God –
*'Through cloud and sunshine,
O abide with me'.*

Through this month of February, Christians will follow the journey of Jesus into the sun-scorched desert where he faced temptation and overcame it and follow him up the mount of Transfiguration with its clouds and glory.

We are comforted to know God's abiding presence with us in all weathers. Through cloud and sunshine, through mountain-top moments and shadowed valleys, through testing wilderness experiences, the fog of unknowing, the battering storm to the calm day. In and through it all, the love of God comes close to us. God is our refuge and our shelter and Jesus is a man for all seasons.

*His plan for today is all that I ask;
With Him I can leave the 'Tomorrow'.
So by faith I can walk, and with Him I can talk;
Just today, with its joy or its sorrow,
He my pathway hath planned, and, led by His hand,
Through the fire while the gold He's refining,
Be it trial or test, He knows what is best,
So I travel where love's light is shining.*

*With no plan of my own, but with Him on the Throne,
And to Him all my problems confiding,
He gives me a song as I journey along,
And His 'fullness of joy' is abiding.
Though the path may be steep, and the storm round me
sweep,
Yet my soul He is constantly feeding;
And my strength He renews and with fresh power endues,
As I walk where my Master is leading.*

To be still when to me He is speaking,
Just to kneel at His feet, in that secret retreat,
Where His face I am constantly seeking.
His plan for today, let it bring what it may,
Be it 'fullness of joy' or 'deep sorrow',
