A message from Reverend Peter

Mothering Sunday 15th March

A teacher gave her class of young children a lesson on the magnet and what it does. The next day in a written test, she included this question:

"My full name has six letters. The first one is M. I pick up things. What am I?"

When the test papers were handed in, the teacher was astonished to find that almost half of the students answered the question with the word Mother.

Mothering Sunday is now commercialised, but it didn't start that way.

When many people worked long hours as servants in large houses, on farms or in factories, Mothering Sunday was the one day in the year when they were allowed to visit their parents. Sometimes they took a special gift, like a Simnel cake, to say thank you for all their mothers had done for them. They also went with their families to their 'Mother Church' to thank God.

Mothering Sunday is a time to thank God for mothers and others who show God's love.

But when we shine a light on a gift – it casts a shadow. Mothering Sunday casts a shadow on some people, perhaps ourselves. Mothering Sunday can prove difficult for those whose mothers have died, whose relationships with their mothers are broken or strained, those who would like to be mothers but can't be, and those whose children have died.

Our all-loving God is especially near these ones as we approach Mothering Sunday. And so we pray -

Thank you, Lord, for all who care
Bless them with your love.
Thanks for mothers everywhere
Bless them with your love.
For those who brighten up our day
Bless them with your love.
Who always have the right words to say
Bless them with your love.
Thanks for hugs, and love and smiles
Bless them with your love.
Thanks for all those extra miles
Bless them with your love.
And when they feel they're not enough
Bless them with your love.
Amen.

An email received from Moira Watson, Mental Health Support Worker.



What a lovely welcome I received again this week from the members of the church attending the Coffee Morning. Almost 2 years to the day since my first visit, at which time I bought a lovely little teabag and a poem handcrafted by friends of St Aubin Methodist Church.

I live in Stonehaven Aberdeenshire and I was in Jersey in 2024 to house-sit for a friend. It was a complete fluke that led me to visit St Aubin on a Thursday morning coinciding with a Coffee Morning. I was made so welcome and had a lovely time chatting to the people who attended that day. However, that little teabag was such a good idea that I devised something very similar to insert into the Christmas Cards of some 125 people who get support from the organisation I work for, Pillar Kincardine in Stonehaven, a mental health charity.

The feedback we have had from that small gesture has been amazing, and it all started with your church! Many of our members are particularly isolated at Christmas time and were very touched that someone was thinking about them. It was made even more special by the fact that members themselves joined in on the project and decorated the little teacup shaped envelopes with Christmas stickers and stamps so that they were all unique.

I wanted to thank you all and tell you that your idea has warmed the hearts of many people in my little corner of Scotland. 😊
